So What? Why Do We Have to Know This?

- 1. Valid question: why DO we have to know this? Kids want to know, how will this help me in my everyday living?
- 2. Catechists: we need to be able to answer this question? This should be the first thing we identify when beginning our planning.
- 3. Begin with the end in mind. What's the BIG idea?
- 4. Follow a catechetical process: St. Ignatius "enter through their door, but be sure to leave through your door." Know where your door leads
 - a. Engage
 - b. Explore
 - c. Reflect
 - d. Respond (the "So, What?" step)
- 5. Examples:

PART ONE: THE CREED - Why do I have to know about...?

Revelation – Because you won't have to look for the "secret" to life.

Scripture and Tradition – Because you'll be able to answer the question, "Sez who?"

Trinity – Because you'll realize that living in community is divine.

Incarnation – Because you'll realize that God understands what you're going through.

Sin, Salvation, and the Cross – Because then you'll have nothing to fear.

The Church, Mary, the Saints, and Eternity – Because you'll recognize that you've got the network.

PART TWO: WORSHIP AND LITURGY - Why do I have to know about...?

Worship and Liturgy – Because then you'll know how to actually encounter God.

Mystery and Sacramentality – Because you'll know how to speak God's language.

Sacraments of Initiation – Because you'll realize that you cannot save yourself...but you can be saved.

Sacraments of Healing – Because you'll learn that you can encounter God in your brokenness.

Sacraments at the Service of Communion – Because you'll recognize that "it's not about you!"

PART THREE: MORALITY – Why do I have to know about...?

Human Dignity, Sin, and Mercy – Because you'll see that you cannot separate love of God and love of neighbor.

The Commandments, Beatitudes, and Virtues – Because then you'll have a guide to happiness. Works of Mercy and Social Justice – Because you'll have concrete ways to show love for others. Conscience and Moral Decision-Making – Because you'll realize that you have to think and take responsibility!

PART FOUR: PRAYER – Why do I have to know about...?

Prayer – Because then you'll realize that you are not alone.
Forms of Prayer – Because you'll see that you have lots of ways to connect with God.
Our Father – Because you'll realize that you have an intimate relationship with God.




