

Old Testament

1. The Pentateuch refers to the first 5 books of the Bible. Name at least two of these books.
Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers, Deuteronomy
2. This man is considered our father in faith. Abraham
3. True or False: The Genesis stories of creation are meant to be understood literally. ___ T X F
4. This man led the Hebrew people from slavery in Egypt to freedom. Moses
5. The Jewish people celebrate this feast to recall how God saved them from slavery in Egypt and led them to freedom. Passover
6. This son of Adam and Eve killed his brother because he was envious of him. Cain
7. This young shepherd became the greatest king of Israel David
8. This gold covered box contained the stone tablets of the 10 Commandments and was carried by the People of Israel through the desert: the Ark of the Covenant.
9. This son of King David built the Temple in Jerusalem King Solomon.
10. These men, like coaches who “got in the face” of the People of Israel, were called Prophets.

Liturgy

1. The 2 main parts of the Mass are the Liturgy of the Word and the Liturgy of the Eucharist
2. This is the meaning of crossing our forehead, lips, and heart before the Gospel reading at Mass:
“May the Word of God be in my mind, on my lips, and in my heart.”
3. We kneel during this part of the Liturgy of the Eucharist: Eucharistic Prayer or Consecration
4. Identify from which part of the Bible the 3 Scripture readings at Mass are drawn:
 - a. 1st reading Old Testament
 - b. 2nd reading Letters
 - c. 3rd reading Gospels

5. This is a phrase that refers to the passion, death, Resurrection, and Ascension of Jesus, which we celebrate at Mass: the Paschal Mystery.

Sacraments

1. The Sacraments of Initiation are Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist.
2. The Sacraments of Healing are Penance and Reconciliation and Anointing of the Sick.
3. The Sacraments at the Service of Communion are Matrimony and Holy Orders.
4. The symbols of Baptism are water, oil, fire, and white garment.
5. We do an examination of conscience to prepare to celebrate this Sacrament: Penance and Reconciliation.

Ten Commandments

1. The first 3 Commandments teach us about love of God while the last seven teach us about love of Neighbor.
2. The first 3 Commandments are:
 - a. I am the Lord your God. You shall have no other gods before me
 - b. You shall not take the name of the Lord your God in vain
 - c. Keep holy the Sabbath Day
3. This is the 4th Commandment which begins at home:
Honor your Father and Mother
4. The 5th, 6th, 7th, and 8th Commandments each complete this sentence: You shall not _____.
 - a. 5th Commandment kill
 - b. 6th Commandment commit adultery
 - c. 7th Commandment steal
 - d. 8th Commandment bear false witness against your neighbor
5. The 9th and 10th Commandments teach us not to do this with regards to our neighbor's goods or spouse: covet.
