Creed: Revelation	 (2:56)	From Outside Da Box Productions – Youth Ministry Videos. When you recite the Creed, are you being real or are you being a robot? Do you even know what you are saying? Is there a difference between believing there is a God and believing in God? The Creed contains the truths God has revealed to us.
Creed: Scripture and Tradition	 (2:27)	An overview of how the Catholic Church safeguards revelation: Scripture and Tradition. From vocationnetrowk.org.
Creed: The Trinity	 (2:39)	Some of us have heard the phrase "God in three persons, Blessed Trinity." What does that mean? Bishop Don Hying has more on this divine trio. Creed: Jesus (Christology)	 (4:34)	This is a clip of Fr. Barron's (WordOnFire.org) project: CATHOLICISM. This short clip is from episode one and it's called "Amazed and Afraid: The Revelation of God Become Man". It begins to tackle questions like...Who is Jesus? Should we be amazed and afraid of Him? Have we domesticated Him too much? Do we fully grasp the significance of what He claims to be? This clip was filmed in Israel and Rome on Fr. Barron's first trip to the Holy Land for this project.
Creed: The Marks of the Church	 (3:31)	At Mass, we profess belief in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. What does that mean?
